Please include the following text in your email or written letter.

I am formally objecting to sites M13 & M10-Stonecastle Farm and Moat Farm extensions under regulation 19 of the Kent Mineral sites plan.

Below are some examples of why the plan is not sound and reasons why you should be concerned.

You may wish to include these in your formal objection.

- Loss / Impact on Green Belt
- Huge Increase in HGV's passing through our villages
- Cumulative effect of further quarrying
- Environmental impact/damage
- Impact on Community and Well Being
- Increased Flood Risk – Flood Plain Zone 3
- Potential pollution to river Medway
- Visual impact - High Weald AONB
- No Climate Change mitigation
- Loss of wildlife
- Loss of plant life/Biodiversity
- Loss of productive agricultural land
- Lack of detailed economic justification
- Lack of detailed aftercare provisions
- No positive benefits to the Community
- Restoration of land to agriculture, not more lakes
- Repeat of prior breaches of rules
- Impact on local economy and businesses
- Noise, dust & light pollution
- Geological Concerns
- Safety on Public Rights of Way on site
- Loss of agricultural and associated employment
- Site dormancy periods (e.g. 2008-2018 re "market forces"), prolongs misery for locals and wrecks wildlife
- No escape from impact on weekdays and Saturdays for those living close
- Increased flood risk to villages that already flood – Up to date EA SFRA needed
- Rat running through villages to avoid traffic delays, creates damaging vibration, noise, air pollution and safety issues
- Road Safety - especially at the Whetsted Road/A228 Junction near site entrance. (KCC/Police recognised Crash area)
- Significant increase in HGV's on A228, acknowledged as being narrow, congested and requiring by-passes
